



# DOING MISSION TOGETHER GROUPS

To the public, there is only one The Salvation Army, but internally, we tend to operate separately.



Doing mission together is better – better for our clients, good for Salvationists, good stewardship, and more likely to bring people into the Kingdom of God. But it doesn't happen naturally – only with intent.

So we're forming regional Doing Mission Together Groups to help centres look for opportunities to do mission together.

## Doing Mission Together Groups – What are they?

- A regular gathering of representatives from all Salvation Army centres within a region (the group chooses how often – at least twice per year)
- A chance to get to know each other's services and to look for opportunities to do mission together.

## How will they work?

Each group will follow five simple steps to address our SILOS ...

	<b>1. Start</b>	DHQ to identify geographic regions and assign coordinators (for both divisionally and nationally managed programmes)
	<b>2. Invite</b>	Coordinator invites local representatives to an initial meeting
	<b>3. Learn</b>	Group meets and seeks to learn from each other Group may choose to visit each other's centres
	<b>4. Opportunities</b>	Group looks for opportunities to do mission together
	<b>5. Serve</b>	Centres serve each other as per agreed opportunities Group decides how often to keep meeting
